- 6: Regional telecoms: Case studies from regional ISPs and telcos who face local markets.

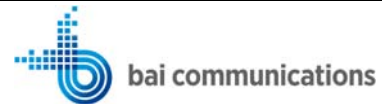

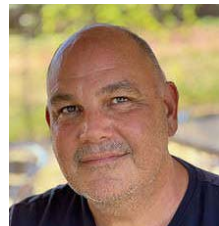
